Maintaining the trails is an ongoing process, and thus the Mountain "Adopt-a-Trail" initiative was introduced this month. Several trails already have been adopted: but there are more than a dozen that remain, awaiting seasonal caretakers to clear overgrowth, pick up fallen branches, and ensure the trails are navigable for all who visit the Mountain. The initiative is intended to allow individuals to come three or so times a vear, at their convenience, to participate in basic trail maintenance; no heavy lifting or mowing is involved. This is an opportunity to preserve the beauty and wonder of the Mountain trails for others while, at the same time, immersing oneself in nature's tranquility and peace.

<u>Help Wanted!</u> <u>Housekeeping Needs Following Overnight Gatherings</u>


As the above piece noted, Mari Snyder is set to move on to her next phase of life, and we couldn't be happier she committed a year to live in community at the


